League Information

- Volunteer Coaches needed at all grade levels!
- Coaches choose the practice time/location
- Saturday games begin at 9:00am and Sunday games begin at 10:00am. Last game times of the day vary depending on number of teams.
- All teams play 7 games at Robbins Park
- Playoffs for 3rd-8th grade
- Equipment: Mouth guard is required and rubber molded cleats are recommended
- All players receive a league Jersey. Playoff champions receive a trophy and all 1st and 2nd graders receive medals.
- Games will end late in October
the season can be extended 2-3 weeks due to rainouts
Games will be played on Columbus Day weekend

How Will Teams Be Formed?

The goal of the league is for all kids to learn the game of football in a safe and fun atmosphere. While we encourage a competitive spirit in all players and coaches, all league decisions are made with the best interest of the majority of children involved. We know we cannot place each child with their best friend, so ***we do not accept team placement requests.*** We do make every attempt to place children on a team with at least some of their schoolmates, however, this is not always possible, and ***is not guaranteed.***

The Recreation Supervisor will be responsible for selecting all teams. Teams will be constructed using the following criteria: grade level, number of years in the league, and what school they attend. This process is not intended to single out the dominant or weaker athletes, but it is done with the knowledge that dominant teams have a negative effect on the league as a whole, and present no positive outcomes.

The Recreation Supervisor will make all final team placement decisions.
